Primary active pharmaceutical ingredient

Clomiphene citrate

Main indication

Induction of ovulation in patients with ovulatory dysfunction who wish to conceive

Common tablet strengths

25 mg, 50 mg, 100 mg

Clomiphene is a selective estrogen receptor modulator that works by blocking estrogen feedback at the hypothalamus and pituitary. That interruption encourages release of follicle-stimulating hormone (FSH) and luteinizing hormone (LH), which can provoke

ovulation in people with oligo-ovulation or anovulation and improve chances of conception when used as directed.

In the United States the Food and Drug Administration approves clomiphene for management of ovulatory dysfunction in patients pursuing pregnancy. Use in males, for improved athletic performance, or as a post cycle therapy following anabolic steroid use are off-label and have distinct safety and legal risk considerations. 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How to take a bite Clomid as prescribed

Always follow the dosing and schedule provided by your prescriber. Tablets should be swallowed with water and taken at approximately the same time each day. Do not increase dose or lengthen the number of cycles without medical instruction.

- Typical starting regimen: 50 mg once daily for 5 days, often begun on cycle day 3, 4, or 5 as advised by your clinician.
- If ovulation does not occur: the clinician may raise the dose in a subsequent cycle to 100 mg once daily for 5 days; do not self-adjust.
- Most responders show effect within the first three cycles; many treatment plans limit use to approximately 3 to 6 cycles depending on response and risk and safety considerations.
- Timing intercourse or insemination: clinicians frequently recommend intercourse every 1 to 2 days starting about 5 days after the last tablet, or per individualized instructions.
- Observation and tracking: your care team may use home LH kits, serum hormone tests, and/or transvaginal ultrasound to detect ovulation and to reduce risks; see [Risk Mitigation Measures and Environmental monitoring](#).

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Protective Measures and Tracking

Clomiphene is generally prescribed for short treatment courses. Your specialist will individualize the number of cycles and tests needed.

- Do not use clomiphene continuously for long-term therapy; periodic review by your clinician is required.

- Multiple pregnancy risk (for example twins) is increased compared with spontaneous conception; discuss this with your provider before we get started.
- Report visual disturbances such as blurred vision, flashes, or new floaters immediately and avoid driving until evaluated.
- Stop therapy and contact your clinician promptly if you suspect pregnancy.
- Attend any recommended clinic visits for blood tests or ultrasound ongoing monitoring to assess ovarian response and to minimize the risk of ovarian hyperstimulation.
- Do not add other fertility medications unless they are prescribed as part of a coordinated treatment plan by a fertility specialist.

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Who Should Not Try It

Avoid clomiphene if any of the following situations apply, unless a specialist has explicitly cleared its use:

- The pregnancy is either known or suspected.
- Caregiving through nursing a baby.
- Unexplained uterine or vaginal hemorrhage that has not been assessed.
- Active liver disease or a history of significant hepatic dysfunction.
- Ovarian cysts or enlargement not related to polycystic ovary syndrome without further evaluation.
- A current or prior diagnosis of hormone-sensitive cancer of the breast or ovary without specialist approval.
- Significant pituitary or adrenal disorders.
- Current or past thromboembolic events or major vascular disease.
- Severe pelvic pathology or endometriosis that requires tailored assessment.
- Allergy to clomiphene or any tablet component.

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Potential post use effects

Seek emergency care for signs of a severe reaction.

Severe or acute responses

- Allergic symptoms: rash, hives, itching, swelling of face, lips, tongue, or throat.
- Visual disturbances: sudden blurring, flashes, difficulty focusing, or new floaters.
- Ovarian hyperstimulation syndrome (OHSS): severe pelvic or abdominal pain, rapid weight gain, pronounced bloating, persistent nausea or vomiting.
- Extreme pain in the abdomen with fever or unrelenting vomiting (may indicate pancreatitis or other serious conditions).

Shared effects that are generally transient.

- Hot flashes or episodes of flushing.
- Noticeable tenderness in the breasts or discomfort.
- Mild abdominal cramping, nausea, or bloating.
- Pulsating head pain.
- Spotting or changes in menstrual bleeding pattern.
- Mood swings that include irritability.

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Medication and supplement interpersonal dialogue and exchanges with others are the core of collaboration.

Provide your healthcare team with a complete list of prescription medicines, over the counter products, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Several agents may alter fertility treatment or interact with hormone signaling.

- Herbal products promoted for female reproductive health such as vitex (chasteberry), black cohosh, and blue cohosh may affect outcomes.
- Supplemental androgens or androgen precursors, for example DHEA, can influence response.
- Other selective estrogen receptor modulators or hormonal drugs should not be combined unless directed by your fertility specialist.

This is not the full list. Prior to the process starting, stopping, or changing any medicine or supplement consult your pharmacist or prescriber.

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Did not take dose and Drug experiencing an overdose Concerns

- Dose missed: if you forget a dose, take it when you remember unless the next dose is due soon. If the next scheduled dose is imminent, skip the a dose was missed. Do not take an extra dose in order to catch up on dosing.

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External the warehouse provides ample storage for all shipments.

- Keep medicines away from curious children and pets alike.
- Store at room temperature, typically 59 to 86 degrees F (15 to 30 degrees C).
- Protect from excessive heat, moisture, and direct light. Keep tablets in their original container with the cap secured.
- Do not use beyond the expiration date shown on the package. Dispose of unused medication via local take-back programs when available.

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Options for Alternative routes and Related Drugs

Depending on the diagnosis, age, and previous responses, clinicians may consider other prescription options in the United States:

- Letrozole (aromatase inhibitor): commonly favored for ovulation induction in patients with polycystic ovary syndrome; studies suggest comparable or better live birth rates and a reduced risk of multiple gestation versus clomiphene.
- Tamoxifen: another SERM occasionally used off-label when clomiphene is not suitable.
- Metformin: may help restore ovulation in insulin-resistant PCOS patients when used alone or with other agents.
- hCG trigger injections: used to precisely time ovulation in conjunction with oral or injectable regimens.
- Gonadotropin injections (FSH/LH): reserved for cases where oral agents fail or in specific protocols; require close continuous monitoring because of increased OHSS and multiple gestation risk.

Non-pharmacologic measures such as weight optimization, smoking cessation, and managing underlying endocrine conditions can also improve fertility prospects. Selection of therapy should be individualized by a fertility specialist.

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Rough Anticipated USD prices

Cash pricing tiers brackets can vary widely by pharmacy, geographic area, insurance coverage, and available discounts. These estimates exclude clinic and health monitoring fees.

- Letrozole 2.5 mg tablets: approximately 3 to 20 USD for a small supply (for example 5 tablets).
- Generic clomiphene citrate 50 mg tablets: roughly 15 to 60 USD for 5 tablets (one common short cycle); 25 to 120 USD for 10 tablets.
- Brand Clomid (when available): often 150 to 250 USD or more per typical 5-tablet treatment course.

- Tamoxifen 10 to tablets delivering 20 mg: around 5 to 20 USD for a 10-tablet supply.
- hCG trigger injection: commonly 50 to 150 USD per dose.
- Gonadotropin injections (FSH/LH): frequently 500 to 2000 USD or more per cycle depending on dose and product.

Insurance benefits, manufacturer assistance programs, coupons, and pharmacy discount plans can reduce out-of-pocket costs. Fertility clinic packages and watchful oversight services often represent significant additional expenses.

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The status of lawful authorization and regulatory scheme in the United States

- Prescription only: clomiphene is an Rx medication approved by the FDA for ovulatory dysfunction in patients seeking pregnancy.
- Off-label prescribing: clinicians may provide off-label prescriptions for certain indications (for example select male infertility cases) with appropriate evaluation and consent. Use as post cycle therapy after anabolic steroids is off-label and should only occur under medical supervision.
- Telemedicine: prescribing by telehealth requires a valid patient-provider relationship which must comply with federal and state law. Obtain medicines from licensed US pharmaceutical stores.
- Online pharmacy safety: verify the pharmacy licensure with your state board of pharmacy and consider NABP .pharmacy accreditation when available. Importing prescription medicines into the United States is subject to strict rules and is generally restricted.
- Compounded versions: compounding by licensed pharmacies for valid prescriptions is permitted under state and federal rules; availability and quote pricing vary.
- Anti-doping rules: clomiphene is prohibited by the World Anti-Doping Agency and by USADA. Athletes subject to testing may face sanctions if clomiphene is detected no matter when.
- Expecting mothers and breastfeeding mothers: not recommended; discontinue and contact your clinician immediately if pregnancy is suspected.

If you obtain medication online, ensure the provider and dispensing pharmacy are properly licensed and follow legal requirements for controlled prescribing.
