Overview snapshot

Tadalista is a marketed preparation of tadalafil, a prescription medicine most commonly used to treat erectile dysfunction in adult men. It helps support erections in response to sexual stimulation but does not by itself cause sexual desire.

- The main active substance is Tadalafil
- Main use: Erectile dysfunction in adult men
- Common tablet strengths: 10 mg, 20 mg; daily lower-dose options 2.5 mg and 5 mg may be prescribed
- Usual onset of effect: about 30 minutes for many people
- Typical duration of effect: may last up to 36 hours

Tadalafil is also prescribed at low daily doses for benign prostatic hyperplasia and as a different formulation for pulmonary arterial hypertension. Availability of brands and approved signals pointing to varies; speak to your prescriber for what is suitable for you.

Dosing and Administration Guidance Tadalafil

Your clinician will decide the most appropriate dosing. Always follow that prescription and do not exceed the advised dose.

On-demand use

- Take one tablet approximately 30 minutes before sexual activity.
- Swallow with water; taking with food is acceptable but very high fat meals can slow onset.
- Do not use more than one on-demand dose within 24 hours.

Typical on-demand doses are 10 mg or 20 mg. Some preparations or pack sizes may list larger strengths; only use those if your prescriber has recommended them.

Daily use (when prescribed)

A continuous low daily dose (for example 2.5 mg or 5 mg once daily) is an another route for men who prefer spontaneity or who also have symptoms of BPH. If you are switching between daily and on-demand schedules, consult your prescriber first.

How It Works in Practice

Tadalafil is part of the pharmacologic class of PDE5 inhibitors. During sexual arousal, nitric oxide release increases levels of cyclic GMP in penile tissue, which relaxes smooth muscle in the corpora cavernosa and allows increased blood flow. Tadalafil reduces the breakdown of cyclic GMP, supporting erection maintenance when sexual stimulation occurs.

Important: sexual stimulation is required for the medicine to work. For timing and drug dosing instructions, see [Dosing and Safe Methods for Taking](#).

Safety guidelines and Safe Practices Considerations

- Intended for adult men. Not for use by women or children unless specifically advised by a specialist for other hints.
- Avoid heavy alcohol intake around dosing because it can worsen dizziness and reduce erectile function.
- If you have heart disease or have been told to avoid sexual activity, do not use tadalafil until cleared by a doctor.
- If you have impaired kidney or liver function, dose adjustments may be necessary; inform your prescriber.
- Tell your clinician if you have blood disorders, penile curvature, or prior vision or hearing problems.
- If you experience chest pain, faintness, or significant nausea during sexual activity, stop and seek medical help immediately.
- If you feel lightheaded after taking the tablet, avoid driving or operating machinery.

Drug Contacts and interpersonal dialogue and exchanges span conversations, gestures, and feedback.

Certain medicines and substances can interact with tadalafil and change its safety or effectiveness. Do not take nitrates with tadalafil any time you prefer.

- Nitrates and nitric oxide donors (for example nitroglycerin tablets, patches, sprays, isosorbide mononitrate/dinitrate, or recreational amyl/butyl nitrite) can cause dangerously low blood pressure when combined with tadalafil.
- Alpha-blocking agents used for prostate or blood pressure (for example tamsulosin, doxazosin, terazosin) may produce additive blood pressure lowering; use under medical supervision.
- Strong CYP3A4 inhibitors (for example ketoconazole, itraconazole, clarithromycin, ritonavir) can raise tadalafil concentrations and may require dose modification or avoidance.
- CYP3A4 inducers (for example rifampicin, carbamazepine, phenytoin) can lower tadalafil levels and reduce its effect.
- Excessive alcohol increases the chance of dizziness and fainting.
- Grapefruit and grapefruit juice may increase tadalafil exposure in some people.
- Please do not combine.. tadalafil with other oral PDE5 inhibitors or alprostadil unless advised by a specialist.

Situations that preclude therapy

- Use with any nitrate therapy or nitric oxide donors is contraindicated.
- Known hypersensitivity to tadalafil or any excipient in the product.
- Unstable or severe cardiovascular conditions where sexual activity is inadvisable.

Special caution or specialist review is recommended after recent heart attack or stroke, in severe hypotension or uncontrolled hypertension, and with certain inherited retinal disorders. See [Safety and precautionary practices](#) for additional detail.

Possible unwanted adverse effects

Many negative effects are dose related and may become less bothersome with time or with a lower dose. Commonly reported effects include:

- Headache pain
- The process of flushing
- Stomach upset or reflux
- Runny or congested nose
- Pain along the back or soreness in the muscles
- Temporary changes in color vision

Not common reactions can include dizziness, allergic reactions, chest discomfort, abnormal liver tests, prolonged erection (priapism), hearing loss, or serious skin reactions. Obtain immediate medical care for numbness or weakness sudden loss of vision, sudden hearing decrease, an erection lasting more than four hours, severe chest pain, or signs of a severe allergic response such as facial swelling or breathing difficulty.

Skipped medication dose incident Help and Instructions

As-needed dosing: there is no fixed schedule. Do not take another on-demand dose within 24 hours.

Daily dosing: if you forget a daily tablet, take it when you remember unless it is close to the next dose. Do not double the next tablet to make up a not taking the dose.

Medication experienced an overdose Guidance

If you suspect an a drug overdose, seek emergency medical help immediately or contact your local emergency number. Symptoms may include severe recurring headache, fainting, visual disturbances, low blood pressure, lightheadedness, or prolonged erection. In Australia you can call the Poisons Information Centre on 13 11 26 for urgent advice.

Storage and Disposal Procedures

- Store in a cool, dry place at room temperature with the container tightly closed.

- Store this where children and pets cannot reach or see it.
- Do not use after the date of expiry printed on the pack.
- Return unused or expired drugs to a pharmacy so they can be disposed of safely.

When travelling, keep medicines in original packaging with your prescription. Inspect the status [legal requirements](#) for importing medicines into Australia or the country you are visiting.

Other Options and Similar Medicines

Several plan B routes for erectile dysfunction exist; choice depends on medical history, timing preferences, and budget. Talk with your healthcare provider about the options.

Consider these oral PDE5 inhibitor options

- Cialis (tadalafil brand) - same active drug as Tadalista; available as on-demand and daily formulations and can last up to 36 hours.
- Sildenafil (Viagra and generics) - usually works within 30-60 minutes and lasts about 4-6 hours; high fat meals can slow onset.
- Vardenafil (Levitra and generics) - comparable to sildenafil, with 4-6 hour duration and less food effect in some people.
- Spedra, Avanafil - often has a faster onset (sometimes 15-30 minutes) and provides effect for around 6 hours.

Non-drug and adjunct treatments

- Vacuum erection systems combined with constriction rings
- Couples counseling through psychosexual therapy
- Testosterone replacement when low levels are documented and indicated
- Injected or intraurethral agents such as alprostadil under specialist supervision

Never combine two oral PDE5 inhibitors or mix with injectable agents unless specifically directed by a specialist. For dosing specifics, refer to the dosing guidelines. [How to take a break and dose for adults Properly.](#)

Australia Indicated Prices shown in AUD

Prices vary by brand, pharmacy, pack size, and whether the product is purchased locally or imported. The figures below are approximate and provided for planning purposes only.

- Generic tadalafil (Australian pharmacies): roughly AUD 2 to AUD 10 per 10-20 mg tablet depending on pack and supplier.
- Cialis (brand tadalafil): often AUD 15 to AUD 30 per 10-20 mg tablet; small packs can cost AUD 80 to AUD 120.
- Generic sildenafil tablets of 50-100 mg usually cost from AUD 1 to AUD 6.
- Imported generics (for example Tadalista) via personal importation with a valid prescription: bulk prices may be around AUD 1 to AUD 5 per 20 mg tablet, excluding shipping and any customs fees.

Cost saving measures: request a generic equivalent, conduct a comparison prices at multiple pharmacies, consider larger pack sizes, or discuss whether daily versus as-needed dosing is more economical for your usage. Note that PBS subsidy for ED medicines is not generally available; retain receipts and prescriptions for records. See [notes concerning the law](#) on importation.

Legal Requirements and Regulation in Australia

- Scheduling: tadalafil is classified as Schedule 4, meaning a valid prescription is required from an Australian prescriber to obtain it from a pharmacy.
- TGA regulation: medicines supplied in Australia should be registered with the Therapeutic Goods Administration. Some imported brands may not be TGA-registered; pharmacists can advise on registered other possibilities.
- Personal Import Program: individuals may import up to a three month supply of a prescription medicine for personal use if they hold a valid Australian prescription and other conditions are met. Keep prescription and invoice documentation and ensure the product is not for resale.
- Online pharmacies: choose Australian-registered pharmacies that display a physical address and registration details. Avoid websites that dispense prescription medicines without a valid prescription.
- Telehealth: prescriptions issued via telehealth are commonly accepted in Australia; repeats and intervals are at the prescriber's discretion.
- Travel: carry medicines in original packaging with the prescription and inspect the documentation rules for destination countries.

- Age restrictions and misuse: not for minors and do not share prescription medicines with others.

Athletes: take note

PDE5 inhibitors like tadalafil are medical treatments for defined conditions and are not performance-enhancing substances. Current anti-doping rules generally do not list these medicines as prohibited, but regulations can change. Check with Sport Integrity Australia and your sport's governing body for the current status before you begin using.

Top Frequently Asked Questions

Can I take tadalafil with food or alcohol?

Yes, tadalafil may be taken with or without food. Very high fat meals can delay onset. Limit alcohol as it can increase dizziness and reduce erectile response. See [Safety measures](#).

May I switch between a daily dosing schedule and on-demand dosing?

Only do so under the guidance of your prescriber. Changing regimen without medical advice is not recommended. See [Dosing Method and Steps to Take](#) check the details section for more relevant information.

Is it safe to combine tadalafil with other ED medicines?

No. Combining tadalafil with other oral PDE5 inhibitors or injectable ED agents can increase risk and is not recommended unless a specialist advises otherwise. See [Drug Interaction Notifications](#).
