

# Artvigil Purchase in India: Supplier Network - in Australia

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Scope and a general survey of the material

Artvigil is a commercial preparation of armodafinil, a prescription-only wakefulness agent. In Australia it is supplied only with a valid prescription. Health professionals prescribe it to reduce excessive daytime sleepiness associated with certain sleep disorders. - Frequent applications in clinical medicine: narcolepsy, shift work disorder, and as an add-on for residual sleepiness in obstructive sleep apnea (with primary therapy in place)
- Active moiety: armodafinil, the R-enantiomer of modafinil
- Common formulation: tablets typically sold as 150 mg strengths

## What makes this work

Armodafinil promotes alertness through actions that include inhibition of the dopamine transporter, altering dopaminergic neurotransmission and affecting multiple wakefulness pathways. It differs from racemic modafinil by containing only the R-enantiomer, which can produce a longer effect in some people.

- Usual onset of effect: around 1 to 2 hours after dosing
- Typical duration of action: roughly 10 to 14 hours, individual variation occurs
- Elimination half-life: generally reported near 12 to 15 hours

To reduce nocturnal sleep disturbance, schedule doses earlier in the waking day. See [dosing schedule guidance](#) and practical [required precautions](#).

## Who the target audience is (Indicators of status)

Treating clinicians may consider armodafinil for adults with persistent daytime sleepiness when caused by:

- Narcoleptic disorder
- Shift work sleep disorder (sleepiness tied to night or rotating shifts)
- Obstructive sleep apnea with ongoing residual sleepiness despite effective airway therapy

Important: armodafinil does not replace adequate sleep and should be used alongside appropriate management of the underlying sleep condition. Athletes or people in

regulated industries should check [sport and workplace rules](#) read instructions before first use.

## Dose and timing

Follow the prescriber's instructions. Artvigil can be taken with or without food; try to take it at the same part of the day to maintain consistent effects and avoid insomnia.

- The condition called narcolepsy or obstructive sleep apnea (adults): standard starting dose is 150 mg once each morning. Some patients may be adjusted up to 250 mg daily when clinically justified and monitored.
- Shift work disorder: a single 150 mg dose taken about one hour before the start of the work shift is usual.

Tips for use: avoid late-afternoon or evening dosing. Older patients and those with marked hepatic impairment may need lower doses. Reassess benefit and feasibility within reach side effects within a few weeks of starting and at regular intervals thereafter. If you forget to take your dose, talk to your doctor. ## Safety advisories and counselling

Give your prescriber a complete medical and medication history. Caution is advised in people with:

- Diseases affecting the cardiovascular system, uncontrolled high blood pressure, or structural heart conditions
- Considerable impairment of liver or renal function
- Current or past psychiatric disorders such as depression, psychosis, or bipolar disorder
- History of substance dependence

Pregnancy and lactation care: discuss risks and benefits in liaison with your clinician. Armodafinil may reduce the effectiveness of combined hormonal contraceptives; consider reliable non-hormonal contraception during treatment and for two months after stopping. Until you know how the medicine affects you, avoid driving or operating heavy machinery.

A beverage containing alcohol: combining alcohol with armodafinil may produce unpredictable effects and is best avoided. For workplace policies and testing, see [legality and access](#).

## Not indicated conditions

- A history of hypersensitivity to armodafinil, modafinil, or any excipient contained in the tablet.
- Previous severe skin reactions or allergic responses to modafinil-class medicines
- Not routinely recommended for children due to limited data on safety and efficacy

If a rash or allergic symptom appears, stop the medicine and seek medical attention immediately. See [additional effects](#) for details on severe dermatologic reactions.

## Aftereffects and safety alert notices warning messages

Frequent, mild reactions include:

- Nausea
- A head pains
- Dizziness episode
- Difficulty falling asleep or fragmented sleep

Uncommon but potentially serious events that require urgent evaluation:

- Widespread or blistering skin rash, mucous membrane ulcers, or peeling skin
- Facial swelling, throat tightness, or breathing difficulty
- Signs suggestive of liver injury such as jaundice, dark urine, or severe abdominal pain
- New or worsening mood symptoms, agitation, hallucinations, or suicidal thoughts
- Chest pain, palpitations, unexplained shortness of breath, or leg swelling

Serious rashes typically arise within the first few weeks of treatment. Discontinue armodafinil and seek emergency care if a rash or severe systemic symptoms develop. For intentional overdose features and emergency contacts, see [take too much medicine](#).

## Interactions among users between medicines

Armodafinil can affect liver enzyme systems in conjunction with therefore alter levels of other medicines. Core a reciprocal exchanges in a system describe exchanges between components. include:

- Hormonal contraceptives: reduced efficacy, consider backup contraception and refer to [protective steps](#)
- Warfarin: changes in INR may occur; monitor closely when starting or stopping armodafinil
- Strong CYP3A4 inhibitors (for example ketoconazole): may raise armodafinil concentrations
- CYP3A4 inducers (for example rifampicin, carbamazepine, phenytoin, St Johns wort tea): may lower armodafinil exposure
- Medicines metabolised by CYP2C19 (for example omeprazole, diazepam): levels can be increased
- The calcineurin inhibitor Cyclosporine: armodafinil may reduce cyclosporine levels

Always provide your clinician and pharmacist with a current list of prescribed, over-the-counter and herbal products to check for potential positive the act of interactions enhance user satisfaction..

## Remedies for a not taking my dose

If you remember the missed tablet and will remain awake for several more hours, take it at that time. If bedtime is near, skip the i forgot to take the prescribed dose and continue as prescribed the next day. Do not take more than one dose at once to catch up.

Recurrent i did not take my prescribed doses may mean the dosing time needs adjustment; discuss this with input from your prescriber. ## An the person overdosed and emergency care readiness steps

Suspected non-fatal overdose requires urgent medical attention. In Australia call 000 for emergency assistance, or contact the Poisons Information Centre on 13 11 26. Symptoms that may indicate non-fatal overdose include:

- Severe restlessness, agitation, or pronounced insomnia
- Confusion, hallucinations, or disorientation
- Gastrointestinal upset such as persistent vomiting or diarrhoea
- Cardiac symptoms including chest pain, rapid or irregular heartbeat, or breathlessness
- Marked anxiety or panic

Bring the medicine packaging and any remaining tablets to the emergency department if possible.

## **Secure physical storage keeps goods safe and organized. and handling specifications**

- Keep tablets in their original blister or labelled container.
- Store at room temperature, ideally between 20 and 25 C, away from high humidity and heat; avoid bathroom external storage expands available space for files. and leaving in vehicles.
- Place out of reach of children and pets. and do not use expired products.

For safe disposal ask your pharmacist about return or take-back programs. If importing under the A Scheme for Personal Importation, retain original packaging and prescription documents for customs inspection; see [legal clearance for access](#).

## **Plant based therapies and approaches**

Depending on diagnosis, side effect profile and comorbidities, clinicians may recommend a substitute method treatment modalities. Discuss options with your prescriber to find the best fit.

- Armodafinil brands: Waklert or Nuvigil are other branded preparations containing the same active ingredient and are expected to produce similar clinical effects at equivalent doses.
- Modafinil (Provigil or generic): contains both R- and S-enantiomers; many patients find similar benefit though duration and response may differ.

- Solriamfetol (Sunosi): a dopamine and norepinephrine reuptake inhibitor indicated for excessive daytime sleepiness in narcolepsy and OSA; it can increase heart rate and blood pressure.
- Pitolisant (Wakix): a histamine H3 receptor inverse agonist used in narcolepsy; access in Australia may be limited and subject to special arrangements.
- Classic stimulants: methylphenidate or amphetamine-based agents are sometimes used for narcolepsy but are more tightly controlled (Schedule 8) on Australian soil.
- Non-drug measures: optimization of CPAP therapy for OSA, structured sleep scheduling, strategic light exposure, and mindful caffeine timing often form part of a comprehensive plan.

## Australian price levels (AUD) and a brief comparison

The figures below are approximate retail cash prices for a 30-tablet supply and will vary by brand, pharmacy and region. Where possible the estimated price per tablet is also shown to help comparison.

- Modafinil 200 mg (generic): around 80 to 150 AUD per 30 tablets; roughly 2.70 to 5.00 AUD per tablet
- Armodafinil 150 mg (Artvigil or similar generics): about 90 to 200 AUD per 30 tablets; approximately 3.00 to 6.70 AUD per tablet
- Nuvigil (branded armodafinil): typically at the higher end, often 150 to 300+ AUD per 30 tablets
- Solriamfetol (Sunosi): commonly 180 to 300+ AUD depending on strength and pack size

Importing medicines yourself may reduce out-of-pocket cost (examples seen from 40 to 100 AUD for 30 tablets), but import procedures, shipping fees, customs checks coupled with the need for appropriate prescription documentation can add time and expense. Check legal requirements under [Australian regulations](#) before importing.

## Australia: permission and current legal status for access

- Regulatory classification: armodafinil and modafinil are Schedule 4 prescription-only medicines in the Poisons Standard.

- Prescription requirement: a current prescription from an Australian-registered prescriber is required to lawfully obtain and possess these medicines.
- Dispensing: must be supplied by an Australian pharmacy; possession without valid prescription may contravene state or territory medicines laws.
- PBS subsidy: limited to specific hints and products under strict criteria; many patients pay private prices.
- Program for Personal Importation: individuals may import up to three months supply per shipment for personal use with a valid prescription; goods should be in original packaging. Do not exceed 15 months total supply in any 12-month period across imports.
- Driving and workplace safety: do not drive if affected by sleepiness or undesired consequences. Check employer policies and state road regulations.
- Sporting regulations: modafinil and armodafinil are prohibited in-competition under WADA; athletes generally need a Therapeutic Use Exemption. Verify requirements with Sport Integrity Australia.

If you are unsure about legal compliance or import rules, consult your prescriber, pharmacist or the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA).

## Lightning Fast FAQs

- Are Artvigil and modafinil the same? No. Artvigil contains armodafinil (only the R-enantiomer), while modafinil contains both enantiomers; clinical effects are similar but pharmacokinetics differ.
- Can I combine Artvigil with coffee? Caffeine may worsen jitters or insomnia. Use caution and adjust intake if you notice increased stimulation.
- How fast does it act? Most users notice benefit within 1 to 2 hours of taking a dose.
- Is alcohol safe to use? A drink containing ethanol should generally be avoided while taking armodafinil because social interactions among individuals influence perceptions and decisions. are unpredictable.
- Does it affect contraception? Yes. Armodafinil can reduce the effectiveness of hormonal contraceptives; use reliable non-hormonal methods during treatment and for two months after stopping.
